I am involved to protect my assets and yours, WHY AREN'T YOU? The Board is committed to acting in the best interest of the homeowners and do encourage input from homeowners about various things.

I would like for everyone to know that we are going to make some changes in the way the boards of the past operated. More things are going to be done for the neighborhood. Some of the things include but not limited to:

- A stricter enforcement of Covenants. I suggest everyone read the Covenants and understand that this neighborhood is governed by Covenants. Enforcement will be done equally and fairly. If you receive a violation notice and want to question it please feel free to contact me or the board. Preferably at the board meetings.
